So, as of last October-ish, I started writing blog posts for an eSports organisation called the SimGrid. Long story short, in my spare time, I race virtually on a simulator I have at home, which is how this all came about. Basically, SimGrid is a virtual racing community started by a real-life professional racing driver called David Perel. He started this community about a year ago, which has since become the biggest organisation for racing on this specific game.

One day, there was a message out about their desire to start a blog, which would cover their events in the form of race reports/rundowns, interviews with drivers, announcements and would be paid. I had always wanted to do something in journalism/writing, specifically in motorsport, but wasn't sure where to start, as it would take a lot of time to start my own website and grow it with the resources you would need. So, I decided to take a shot at the position, which I am pleased to say was a success!

Since I joined, I've been writing one or two 1000 word pieces per week to cover all sorts of their events. I started there as the only writer on the team, but as of now, their sister blog, which covers the technical sides of the game, is at about 2500 readers per day. Although I'm not quite sure exactly how much the SimGrid one has, that should be a decent guide as to its size! Essentially, since late last year, I've been writing full-blown race reports like you would get for things like Formula 1 and so on. I've also done other bits and pieces I mentioned earlier for them, which has been hugely useful to my work in usual lessons, and I'm sure will be for my future too.
